Official Launch of Echo Network Africa Foundation - 6th March 2025



On Thursday 6th of March 2025, Echo Network Africa Foundation held an auspicious triplicate function at the Head Office along Muchai Drive. This marked:

3. Celebration of International Women's Day that is annually marked on 8th March, as a precommemoration.

Hon. Martha K. Koome, the Chief Justice and President of the Supreme Court of Kenya was the guest of honour.

ENAF was privileged to have representation from top government officials, esteemed development partners, former Board Members, Local Implementing Partners (LIPs), service providers, participants, international friends of ENAF and members of the fourth estate.

The event marked an opportune time to further amplify ENAF's 2023 -2027 Strategic Plan which articulates retention, growth and expansion - replicating and scaling program initiatives from Kenya to other African counties, having already successfully registered ENAF-USA.



In her remarks, while Her Ladyship the Chief Justice noted the strides and gains made with regard to empowerment of girls and women, she acknowledged that there there is still a long way to go. Stating that progress has been slow, uneven and many times symbolic rather substantive, Hon. Koome made a clarion call.

"We must build a society where women thrive where they have equal access to opportunities, resources and leadership. Systemic barriers and deep-rooted inequalities that have held back women for generations MUST be torn down."

She commended ENAF for the over four decades of being a trailblazer not only in shaping the future of women but also enabling a society where girls and women **thrive** and **lead**.

Beneficiaries gave their testimonials of how their loves had continue been and to be transformed. The development partners highlighted great collaboration that has the anchored by ENAF's values been such as professionalism, integrity, innovation, inclusion, respect, learning and dignity.

There was no shortage of pomp and colour with Nairobi Girl's Chorale providing entertainment throughout the event, which ended with a luncheon.



In the spirit of going to the grassroots level, ENAF's Community Resilience and Livelihoods and Women's Leadership facilitated one of the women running for an **elective post in Beach Management Units**; a preserve for men during previous elective cycles.



Akoko Ms. Rose running for Treasurer at Anyanga Beach, Siaya County had branded reflector posters, caps, aprons and iackets for visibility during the campaign and electioneering period.



The Women's Aspirants Monthly Training took place on Friday 21st March 2025, virtually.

The session which had a focus on Resource Mobilization Module, focusing on equipping women aspirants with the skills to identify, secure and effectively manage resources for their political campaigns, voter mobilization and the importance of early savings through the DTF Savings Scheme.

The session was facilitated by Mr. Barasa Nyukuri, a Leadership & Governance Expert who is a longstanding male champion of Women Leadership in Kenya.

'Be realistic, be cost effective and play within the Law', he emphasized.

The participants in these sessions have the opportunity to learn and be reminded about the DTF Saving Model as a key and strategic partner in their Resource Mobilization journey; specifically in the 2027 General Elections.

In the words of Sheryl Sandberg:

"We need women at all levels, including the top - to change the dynamic; reshape the conversation to make sure women's voices are heard and heeded not overlooked and ignored."
